

## **PROPOSAL**

### **Chapter XIII-State Sanitary Code- Childhood Lead Poisoning**

Proposed Readoption: NJAC 8:51

Proposal Number: PRN 2004-232

Listed in New Jersey Register June 7, 2004

N.J.S.A. 24:14A et seq., which was enacted in 1971, gives local boards of health the primary responsibility of investigating reported cases of childhood lead poisoning. It gives the local board of health the broad authority to determine whether lead hazards exist and to require the removal of lead paint hazards wherever they are found. The purpose of Chapter XIII is to protect children who have been identified with elevated blood lead levels from further damage due to lead hazards.

The Department is proposing to readopt these rules without change so that local health departments can continue to protect children by providing lead hazard investigations.

### **Air Quality Permitting-General Permit - Perchloroethylene Dry Cleaning Facilities** Listed in New Jersey Register June 21, 2004

The Department of Environmental Protection is announcing the availability of a new General Permit regarding perchloroethylene dry cleaning facilities. The General Permit is a pre-approved permit to construct and certificate to operate, issued pursuant to NJAC 7:27-8.8, for one or more types of similar sources at a facility. A permit applicant with a qualifying source can accept and operate under a General Permit, rather than submitting a regular permit application, which would require case by case processing by the Department. Protection of ambient air quality has been addressed in this General Permit through the use of annual solvent limits, annual fuel limits and control device requirements.
