### **Prevention of Air Pollution from Consumer Products**

Proposed Amendments: NJAC 7:27-24.1 through 24.7; and 7:27A-3.10

The Department of Environmental Protection is proposing new rules and amendments at NJAC 7:27-24 which contains standards that control the emissions of volatile organic compounds and toxics from consumer products and establishes requirements that apply to persons who are manufacturers, distributors, suppliers and retailers of consumer products. The proposed new rules and amendments apply to certain chemically formulated consumer products that have VOC's in their formulation such as hair spray, insecticides, and cleaners: and portable fuel container from which VOC's may be emitted when gasoline or other fuels are poured into or out of the container or stored in the container.

The intent of this rule making is to reduce VOC emissions, which are ozone precursors, to assist in the attainment of the one-hour ozone National Ambient Air Quality Standard and the eight-hour ozone health standard; to address the VOC emission reduction shortfall identified by the USEPA; and to implement the Department's State Implementation Plan for Ozone commitment to the USEPA. The proposed amendments will also help reduce fine particulates and potentially reduce toxics, hat are also VOC's or formed from VOC's.

## **PUBLIC NOTICE**

### **Underground Storage Tank Dispenser and Piping Sumps and Spill Catchment Basin**

NJAC 7:14B

Listed in the New Jersey Register: September 15, 2003

The Department of Environmental Protection is requesting that interested persons submit comments concerning potential rulemaking regarding the regulation of underground storage tank dispenser and piping sumps and spill catchment basins. The Department is considering requirements to ensure that spill catchment basins and dispenser and piping sumps do not discharge hazardous substances to the environment. These requirements would include routine tightness testing and an upgrade deadline for underground storage tank facilities to install such equipment. Until facilities have been upgraded with spill catchment basins and dispenser and piping sumps, the Department is also considering requiring routine site investigations for dispenser and tank top fittings without product tight sumps. These amendments are being considered as a result of the number of sites documented by the Department where discharges from leaking dispensers or spill catchment basins have contaminated groundwater.

The Department is interested in obtaining input concerning the following:

- Appropriate tests to ensure the integrity of spill catchment basins and sumps.
- The appropriate tests to ensure the integrity of spill catchment basins and sumps.
- A reasonable upgrade deadline for installing sumps.
- For those dispensers and tank top fittings which do not have product tight sumps, the reasonable frequency for conducting site investigations to determine if discharges have occurred.
